

New Swan Valley Fortified Wine Trail - History in a glass

Fortified wines created in the Swan Valley are some of the most unique and complex made anywhere in the world, often blended from many vintages, and rated among the very best.

The origin of fortified wine styles goes back as far as the 16th century, when a growing number of countries were exporting wines. Long sea voyages, rough conditions and extremes of heat and cold made the wines unstable, with many oxidising during the journey.

In an effort to preserve the wines, winemakers started adding brandy. This resulted in a higher alcohol content (up to 20 per cent), less spoilage and a far more palatable product when the wine reached its destination.

There are 34 wineries showcased on the trail, winemaking traditions and techniques that have been handed down through the generations, have contributed to Swan Valley fortified wines being rated among the best in the world.

From rich and luscious liqueurs made from Muscat and Pedro Ximenez, through to Shiraz, Verdelho, and aged Tawny fortified wines these can all be tasted and enjoyed on this unique trail that is the only dedicated fortified wine trail anywhere in Australia.

Holiday season Tips:

House Burglaries always increase during the holiday season, as this is when people head away during the holiday season and School holidays. There are some simple precautions you can take to ensure your house and contents remain safe while you are away.

- Advise your neighbour that you are going away. Have them clear your letterbox. With the post-Christmas Sales, there's always an abundance of brochures hitting the mail boxes.
- Ask a neighbour to put a bag of rubbish in your bin. Then on bin day, put your bin on the kerb for collection. Ensure that they put your bin back inside after it is emptied.
- A great idea is to buy some affordable PowerPoint timers from your local hardware store.
 Connect these to a few table lamps to turn them on and off at various times. Tip: ensure the
 bedroom lamp is the last one to turn off at the end of the night. You could even have a radio
 set to turn on and off on a talk back station. This gives the impression that there are people
 talking in the house.
- Video doorbells are becoming popular and provide the home owner with the ability to record
 and speak to any person who attends the door when you are not home. If you are using one of
 these and answer whilst not at home. Don't tell them you are away. Mention that you are in 14day quarantine and cannot open the door.

These are some simple points which can be implemented quickly to ensure we keep our home and community safe.

Containers for Change

Thanks to residents Lee Muskett and Gareth Jones for suggesting **Containers for change** as a fundraising opportunity for The Vines Residents Association (VRA). This is a great initiative for raising funds but also a great win for the environment. This program helps reduce the impacts of drink container litter, creating a positive impact for our wildlife by reducing the amount of plastic litter that makes its way into the ocean.

The VRA are delighted to be a registered beneficiary of the Containers for change recycling scheme in Western

Australia (The VRA Scheme ID is C10534672).

For each eligible recycled container, The VRA will receive 10 cents. Most aluminium, glass, plastic, steel and liquid paperboard drink containers between 150ml and 3L are eligible. Please check for the 10c mark on drink containers to ensure they are recyclable. Please remove lids from bottles (lids are also recyclable).







Most glass, plastic, aluminium, steel and paper-based cartons between 150mL and 3L.



Containers not commonly found in litter, including all plain milk, flavoured milks 1L and above, pure juice drinks, wine and spirit bottles, cordials.

Recyclable containers must be bagged up or taped up in cardboard boxes and placed in the trailer/compound area at the drop off point below:

As this is a resident's home address, we ask that you follow the rules above and ensure the area is left clean and tidy.

Australian household waste increases by 30% over the festive season so please make the effort to recycle every container starting today.
