## Ellenbrook Local Area Plan

### Your chance to give feedback


The City of Swan would like your feedback on the draft Ellenbrook Local Area Plan before it is presented to Council for endorsement later this year.

Local Area Planning involves community members working together with the City to identify the specific issues affecting their community, in order to produce a plan that provides solutions to meet the priorities of their local area. The Local Area Plan is therefore an important document for the City to plan for infrastructure and services, and manage change at a local level.

The Ellenbrook Local Area Plan, which covers Ellenbrook, Aveley and The Vines, outlines the community's priorities, (as determined by the feedback received in phase one of the community engagement carried out from March-May 2022), and how the City is committed to addressing these through a number of projects, programs and supporting services.

The initial phase of engagement received 330 responses from residents of the area, plus 2 local businesses.

The results were:



The Ellenbrook Local Area Priorities for 2022-27 have therefore been drafted as:

- Provide more support and social activities for young people
- Protect and retain trees and the natural environment
- Increase visibility of safety and crime prevention initiatives
- Promote Ellenbrook to increase business and service attraction
- Attract local support services to Ellenbrook

One item of note to The Vines is that the proposed structure plans to 2036 allow for 50% more population growth than is actually forecast through to 2036. There appears to be no alignment between housing needs and the proposed development of The Vines Golf Course. However, The Vines Resort is directly identified as the single greatest tourist attraction to the area, with the Plan saying:

"Tourism and Visitor Attractions: The Vines is a well-established international holiday resort and tourism destination with a 36-hole golf course, restaurants, conference and events facilities. The Vines Resort is considered part of the Swan Valley, a key tourism precinct for the City and of great regional significance to the local area, as it contributes to our growing market of visitors, and is one of Western Australia's premier visitor destinations."

## Snap, Send, Solve

### **Example: Community BBQ facilities**

Did you know that you can inform the City of Swan, (plus a number of additional organisations), about community maintenance requirements and other problems via the 'Snap, Send, Solve' app?

This app is free to download on your smart device, and allows you to report issues to the relevant organisation. This includes City of Swan parks & facilities related items, road signs, and verge tree trimming, to name just a few.

It is simple to select the location, (down to a GPS spot if needed), add a description of the problem, and also photographs if you have them. You get a tracking number so you can keep a record of the response.

A member of The VRRA committee spotted that the community BBQ facility in Chardonnay Park needed maintenance, so submitted a ticket via 'Snap, Send, Solve'. Within a very short period of time this was repaired by City of Swan and put back into use. Photos of the before and after are shown to the right - quite a difference.



The History of The Vines documents the initial development of The Vines Resort and Country Club. It tells how the government of the day supported this development to encourage Japanese tourism within Western Australia and enhance tourist opportunities within the beautiful Swan Valley. It documents the highs that were a key part of early life within The Vines; the challenges that residents faced when building their homes within the area; and, now what are seen as even greater challenges in maintaining the areas semi-rural lifestyle due to the threat of redevelopment.

## Wine Talk

### **Focus on Mann Winery**

Every year winery founder Dorham Mann and daughter Anthea release just two sparkling wines, both created the traditional French way, hand-riddled and then aged in the bottle for two years before release. Both are elegant and delicious – a dry rosé-style made from Cabernet Sauvignon, and a dry white made from Cygne Blanc.

Cygne Blanc is a variety that Dorham developed here in the Swan Valley. It literally translates from French to "White Swan". It is also known as White Cabernet, and is thought by many to be Australia's first and only spontaneous indigenous wine grape variety.

The cellar door is open annually in August for approximately six months or until vintage is sold out. Quantities are small and are usually sold out by December.

The Mann dry Rosé is a must for the Christmas table, as served very chilled it is the perfect wine to enjoy with festive fare in our warm summers. However, don't limit yourself to just enjoying it at Christmas - it is perfect and totally delicious anytime of the year.

Dorham is the son of legendary Houghton Winemaker Jack Mann, who was at the helm of 51 consecutive vintages at the Houghton Winery in the Swan Valley. Dorham was inducted as an 'Icon of the Swan Valley' by the Swan Valley Winemakers Association in 2010.

## **Containers for Change**

#### THE VRRA Scheme ID is C10534672

For each eligible recycled container, The VRRA will receive 10 cents. Most aluminium, glass, plastic, steel and liquid paperboard drink containers between 150ml and 3L are eligible. Please check for the 10c mark on drink containers to ensure they are recyclable. Please remove lids from bottles (lids are also recyclable)





Recyclable containers must be bagged up or taped up in cardboard boxes and placed in the trailer/compound area at the drop off point below:
