## **2021 Census**


### The Vines Statistics


Some of the results from the 2021 Census were released at the end of June. This first release included 'Quick Stats' for each suburb. For anyone who loves statistics, this makes for extremely interesting reading!

The population of The Vines is 50.3% male, and 49.7% female. The average age is 39 years. Most households are families (including couples, 87.5%). There are also single people (11.5%) and groups (1.1%).

The majority of people in The Vines on Census night were born in Australia (62.5%), followed by England (12.5%), and then New Zealand (4%) and South Africa (3.9%).

Looking back to previous Census results, there are also some trends which clearly show the massive growth that The Vines has undergone. To give you a snapshot, we've put together the graphs shown to the right. (Note that the car data was not given in 2006, so that trend only goes back 10 years instead of 15 years.)

Note that The VRRA will not take bookings or be responsible for any payments.





It tells how the government of the day supported this development to encourage Japanese tourism within Western Australia and enhance tourist opportunities within the beautiful Swan Valley. It documents the highs that were a key part of early life within The Vines; the challenges that residents faced when building their homes within the area; and, now what are seen as even greater challenges in maintaining the areas semi-rural lifestyle due to the threat of redevelopment.

## Wine Talk

### **Focus on Harris Organic Wines**

Harris Organic Wines in the Swan Valley is home to Perth's only certified organic winery and Australia's only certified organic brandy distillery.

At the winery's two-hectare organic vineyard, (which is located at the northern end of the Swan Valley on Memorial Avenue Baskerville), Duncan Harris produces red, white, fortified and sparkling wine styles, all made with natural yeasts and a minimum of additives and preservatives.



Duncan grew up in Tasmania's Tamar Valley, and came to Perth in 1993, later buying the Swan Valley property in 1998.

The vines are only irrigated by what they receive from the sky, and there is no use of any pesticides, herbicides or chemical fertilisers. Harris Organic is also licensed to distil spirits, and they sell organic vodka, brandy and gin at the cellar door.

Rosie the friendly cat and the free-range chickens roam freely around the vineyard, adding to the relaxed casual atmosphere of this small boutique winery and distillery.

The security service in The Vines has been a hot topic amongst residents over the last month since the change of contractor from Braven to Major Security. The City of Swan website discusses the security service, and notes the following as the expectations:

- Being a visible presence in the community
- Proactively reporting vandalism and damage
- Providing extra eyes and ears to assist police
- Conducting surveillance patrols and reporting suspicious persons or vehicles
- Responding to antisocial behaviour issues and request police assistance, if required
- On request accompanying a property occupier in response to an activated alarm

As mentioned on the front page of this edition, we will be meeting with Major Security to discuss their service to The Vines, and how best residents can interact with them. In the meantime, please continue to contact them on 9278 9696 if you see any suspicious behaviour. They are available 24 hours.
