

UPDATE FROM THE CHAIR

Since the last edition of The Grapevine, we have hand-delivered a leaflet to every letterbox within The Vines which contained an update based on the recent letter sent to golf members by The Vines (WA) Pty Ltd. We appreciate the effort of volunteers who carried out these letterbox deliveries.

The leaflet noted that the letter to golf members omitted crucial details regarding plans for the existing grass driving range and also holes 3 – 11 of the Ellenbrook course. This flags that potentially none of the public concerns raised by golfers, residents and the wider community have been listened to. We will provide further updates on our campaign once we have completed meetings with our media partners and legal teams.

Members of The VRRA should also have received an email from myself asking you to submit questions to The Vines (WA) Pty Ltd on their announced golf course plans, and the lack of information given about the remaining spaces. Thank you to everyone who has already done this. Please remember that, if you would like to ask any questions or provide feedback to The Vines (WA) Pty Ltd on this latest plan, you need to send an email to memberships@vines.com.au by 30th November. You can also 'bcc' The VRRA's email address, or forward your email, if you want to let us know what you've asked.

On another subject, this is a reminder to everyone living on the one acre blocks in The Vines that the City of Swan have strict regulations on the clearing of land. You must adhere to these regulations when carrying out any vegetation work on your block. Watch for an article in a future edition of The Grapevine.

Environment: Feral Bees

Feral European honey bees tend to swarm at this time of year. They can be a considerable nuisance if they invade your home or, as in this case, invade two of your possum boxes.

Fortunately, there are a number of bee-keepers locally who will come and collect the swarms for free. In some cases, they relocate the entire swarm to a bee hive, and on other occasions, they swap the queen for a more docile or productive specimen. It was certainly fascinating to get into a suit and help vacuum up the colony. The hive in the photograph (below middle) was built from scratch in less than a week with the possum box already stuffed with 5 combs of honey/grubs.

As trees continue to be cut down locally, the competition for nesting holes is extreme and the need to preserve old growth trees and to create natural/artificial nesting holes has never been higher.

Sadly, the swarm attacked and killed the 3 month-old baby possum. Fortunately, the mother survived and she is recovering from the stings. She has already re-occupied one of the boxes and it appears as though there is another baby on the way. This further demonstrates the pressure that our native wildlife is under.

Finally, if anyone has space for possum boxes, (or wants to build their own), please drop us a line for more information.
